KFFPING THE FAITH

In October 2019, Briercrest launched the Keeping the Faith campaign to raise \$8.9 million over two years. Campaign gifts were used to establish the Briercrest Education Fund, created for strategic investments in student services, campus facilities, and program offerings. By the grace and favour of God, including the generous support of friends like you, our goal was met in fall 2021. Thank you so much for partnering with us to deliver Christian education that makes a difference in the lives of young disciples!

As we reflect on the past two years, we feel a sense of deep gratitude, and we praise God for his faithfulness to our mission. Yet we recognize our work is not done. We continue to pray with parents and ministry leaders for Christian young adults, 2/3 of whom drift from the faith after high school. It is still the case that, while 1/3 eventually recommit their lives to Jesus, the other 1/3 have permanently abandoned the faith.

However, recent surveys also reveal that attrition rates are significantly lower among young adults who have a dedicated spiritual mentor, serve in camp ministry, or attend a Christian college/university. To state the case another way, those who have meaningful engagement with their faith as they enter adulthood are less likely to lose hope in God or question the relevance of the Church.



While we help our students prepare for their future careers, our highest priority is seeing them develop as followers of Jesus. Their minds, hearts, and souls matter. We have a pivotal role to fulfill discipling this generation of students.

Canadian Thriving in Multivocational Ministry Project (CTMM)

For several years, Briercrest has been considering how to serve tentmaking/multivocational pastors, who represent a growing percentage of ministry leaders in Canada. In fall 2021, we were awarded \$983,572 to launch the Canadian Thriving in Multivocational Ministry project (CTMM).

Rationale

Since multivocational ministry leaders typically confront obstacles their full-time peers do not, they are often unable to access services intended to help them. CTMM will redress this inequity by creating an accessible, affordable, inclusive, and sustainable community of practice to prepare and support multivocational ministry leaders and their families as they build and lead thriving congregations.

Services

Through the project landing page, CTMM will curate free resources, allow participants to shape and track their personal progress, and build a community of

multivocational ministry leaders and their peers across geographical boundaries. Educational content will always be accessible in multiple formats, including scheduled classes and independent studies; online and in-person events; coaching circles and individual mentorships; and so on. CTMM will also offer personal/marriage/family counselling at no cost through Briercrest Seminary. Counselling services can be accessed by multivocational ministry leaders and/or their families as needed.

Flexibility

The exact design of the content is largely yet to be determined, as the project will unfold over the five-year start-up grant period (2022-2026). We will adapt content according



to the confidential feedback collected from participants. CTMM will respond to past and current studies while generating data for future research, thereby expanding understanding of multivocational ministry leaders and their unique needs.

TESOL INTERNSHIPS

The Briercrest TESOL program sent out 18 students on four teams this summer, one pre-internship team of students completing their first year of study and three internship teams nearing the end of their studies.

The two team leaders and three students on the Cambodia pre-internship taught English to three different elementary classes in a school run by a church-based ministry in the capital city of Phnom Penh. They built relationships with the Cambodian students and English teachers, demonstrating the difference a Christ-filled life makes. They also took part in devotions and community outreaches alongside the church's ministry team. Both team leaders are Briercrest TESOL grads and currently teach at a partner school in South Korea; one was a student on the Cambodia pre-internship in 2017.

The Iraq internship had two teams in two different cities in the Kurdistan region where interns taught university students and professionals. One of the team leaders did her internship in Kurdistan (2017) and now works for the partner organization which arranged the internship. Many of the Iraqi students said they had not felt so loved and free to express themselves in class before. One intern wrote in her newsletter: "The fields in this part of the country are fertile and nutrient-dense, but they are also full of rocks. To farm the ground, the rocks must be gradually removed one by one. Our work as teachers is to move rocks, every day, one by one. Each rock that is removed is one step closer to a ground that can yield an abundant harvest."

Finally, one intern taught at a Christian university in Lithuania. This internship offered her an opportunity to see what it would be like to live and teach in eastern Europe. The university students she taught were from various countries in eastern Europe and beyond and were there to increase their English proficiency. Since completing her internship, the intern has now accepted a teaching position in the Czechia.

Briercrest is blessed to see the impact its students make in various parts of the world. Since 2007, Briercrest TESOL interns have taught over 6,400 hours of English to 1,900 university students and teachers in 15 different nations in Asia, Europe, and the Middle East and North Africa regions. Through the support of generous donors, the interns have raised over \$400,000 through on-campus and off-campus fundraising to cover the cost of these trips.





Summer Sports Camps

The 2022 Summer Sports Camps were a huge success! We had over 500 campers join us for youth volleyball and basketball camps.



We thank God for the dedicated coaches who served our guests throughout the summer.

Most volunteer coaches were current student athletes or Briercrest Clipper alumni. Moreover, the Lord showed up in big ways through guest speakers and through the mentorship provided by our coaches.

Camp this year was phenomenal with such a fun and encouraging group of campers and coaching staff. I learned how to be confident speaking in front of large groups and grew in confidence as a leader. I felt like I learned just as

YO@Home

Throughout 2020, when groups could not meet in person because of lockdowns, many youth leaders were reporting feelings of exhaustion and burnout. Recognizing that our annual retreat would not be possible amidst



restrictions, we still wanted to bless youth leaders for all they do to disciple the next generation. So in February 2021, Briercrest launched YQ@Home, an innovative Biblical discipleship program to resource youth ministry leaders during an especially challenging season. The Youth Quake team produced a month of interactive resources and made them available on-demand at no cost. Participation and feedback were so encouraging that we ran YQ@Home again this February, even though we had tentative plans to host in-person sessions in the spring.

By March, most restrictions were lifted in Saskatchewan, allowing us to proceed with a modified version of Youth Quake. After grad, we held Senior High (grades 10-12) and Junior High (grades

7-9) retreats over consecutive weekends. By dividing Youth Quake into two retreats, we were able to cater the main and breakout sessions to the unique needs of both age groups.

Some long-term Briercrest supporters were so excited to see Youth Quake return that they approached us with a matching gift opportunity. They generously committed to match all donations

designated for Youth Quake scholarships. Grade 12 students who would apply to Briercrest during Youth Quake and attend this fall would receive a \$500 scholarship. In total we raised over \$40,000! On behalf of the students these gifts will bless, thank you!


